- What experience do you have with owning a Pembroke Welsh Corgi specifically?
- Do you currently own any pets? If so, are they socialized with other dogs?
- If you have other dogs in your home, please provide details regarding their breed, age, gender, and whether they are spayed or neutered.
- Are there children in your household? If yes, please provide their ages.
- Does anyone in your household have allergies to animals? If yes, please specify the allergen and the severity of the allergy.
- Are you looking for a dog that will be an indoor-only, outdoor-only, or a mixed indoor/outdoor companion?
- Do you rent or own your home? If you rent, please provide confirmation from your landlord that pets are allowed.
- Are you open to working with an adult dog to address any pre-existing habits or behaviors?
- Would you be willing to seek professional dog training, if necessary, to address any behavioral or training concerns?
- If the dog displays issues upon being rehomed (such as anxiety or potty training regression), what steps are you prepared to take to address them?
- If an adult dog is placed with you, do you agree to give the dog adequate time to adjust to its new home before taking them to public spaces (such as dog parks, stores, etc.)?
- Have you ever rehomed or surrendered a dog? If so, please provide the reason(s).
- Are you currently working with a veterinarian? If so, please provide the name and contact information of your vet.
- How do you typically handle behavior issues in dogs?
- How much time will the dog be left alone each day?
- Do you have a fenced-in yard or an alternative way to provide a safe outdoor space for the dog?
- Will you crate?
- How do you plan to provide mental stimulation and physical exercise for the dog?

- Are you familiar with the specific health and care needs of a Pembroke Welsh Corgi, including potential issues like intervertebral disc disease (IVDD)?
- Are you able to provide regular medical care, including vaccinations, flea/tick prevention, and regular vet check-ups?
